RECERTIFICATION UPDATE

Climbing from the Heights of the 2018 Annual Recertification Cycle to Reach the Goals and Targets for 2019.



We sincerely appreciate your continuing efforts throughout the year to prepare for, and actively participate in the annual Recertification process, required for residents of Culpepper Garden.

Working Together – We Win!

September marks the launch of Annual Recertification Interviews for 2019.

Our practice of announcing, rather than scheduling, annual Recertification appointments continues to permit us to conduct individual Recertification interviews more efficiently with the direct involvement of family members and sponsors, and to send and receive more than 6,000 verification documents annually, accurately, and on time.

We ask that you continue to make every possible effort to:

- Keep your announced Recertification appointment, as scheduled,
- Complete all 3 forms we send to you in advance of your interview, and
- Bring all relevant supporting documents to your Recertification interview.



The Social Security Administration's national toll-free number (1-800-772-1213) is available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, and can serve many clients at once.

Calls to request Proof of Income Letters through the automated telephone system last less than 10 minutes.

Proof of Income Letters are typically received within 2 weeks at the address currently on file with the Social Security Administration.

CULPEPPER GARDEN SERVICES

VOLUNTEER DESK- Free Ticket Sign-Up

Please remember to check the 1st floor bulletin board, CCTV monitors, and the Volunteer Desk (in the Administration Office) frequently for announcements of free tickets/opportunities for outside entertainment (e.g., plays, concerts, movies) and sports events. SENIOR LOOP

This service provides free wheelchair-accessible transportation for grocery shopping and **the Library (if specifically requested, in advance)**. The Loop picks up at Culpepper Garden every **Tuesday and Thursday (except for holidays)**. You must register to ride. Fill out an application at the Front Desk. The Front Desk staff will fax your application to their office. You must call the day before the trip to reserve a seat on the van. The phone number for the Senior Loop is **703-892-8747**.

SENIOR LOOP—Target

This run will leave Culpepper Garden the **second Monday of each month** at 11:00 am, and will pick up at Target at 1:00 pm for the return trip. You **DO NEED** to **make reservations** for the trip **no later than 4:00 pm the Friday before the pick-up date**. The phone number is **703-892-8747** (same as the regular Loop). ***If you have not made a reservation, you will not be allowed on the bus. No exceptions.***

DERMATOLOGIST

Monthly Visits on the 1st Wednesday

The Dermatologist will be in our Health Center on **Wednesday, September 5th ONLY**. Sign up at the Front Desk, or On-Site Dermatology will call you with the appointments.

PODIATRISTS

Monthly Visits on the 3rd Monday

Dr. Breiner will be in the Culpepper Garden Clinic on **Monday, September 17, ONLY**. Appointments are made in the order of request at the Front Desk.

MEDICAL DOCTOR

Weekly Visits

Dr. Rana will be at CG Clinic on **Monday, September 10 and 24, starting at 11:00 am**. Dr. Baig will be at the Culpepper Garden Clinic **every Thursday afternoon starting at 2:30 pm**. Appointments are made in the order of request at the Front Desk.

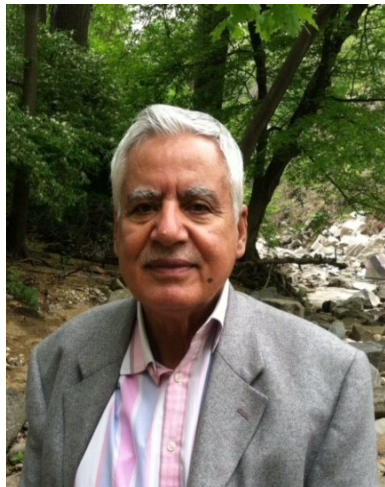
IRS PHONE SCAMS:

RESIDENT SPOTLIGHT— Mohamed Sadiq



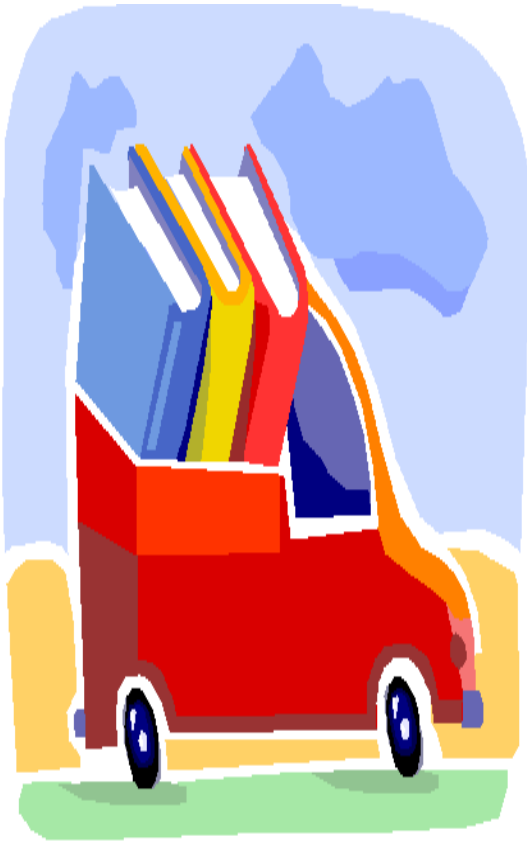
Mohamed, a multi-lingual resident who has lived at Culpepper Garden since 2011, was born in Kerbala, Iraq, the site of a holy shrine, the Mausoleum of Imam Husayn, a grandson of the prophet Muhammad. Every year, up to 45 million pilgrims visit the city to observe the anniversary of Imam Husayn's death. Of Mohamed's five brothers and six sisters, two brothers and five sisters are living and reside in Iraq. He attended a technical institute and received a diploma as an engineer in air conditioning installation and maintenance. After working for three years for the Ministry of Health in Baghdad, he opened his

own air conditioning services company. He met his wife, who was from Pakistan, when he was at the Ministry, and they married when he was 20 and she was 19. They had one son and four daughters. All are married, three live in Pakistan, one in London, and one in Toronto. Mohamed has twelve grandchildren.

Mohamed had 20 years' experience in the air conditioning field when in 1991, the war in Iraq caused disruption and his business could not continue. Once the children were older and of marrying age, his wife decided to take them to Pakistan where her family lived. Iraq had become a dangerous and unstable place to live, with mainly soldiers for daughters to meet. He continued to live in Iraq, and he and his wife later divorced. Although he was not able to continue in air conditioning, he used his former office to begin his own travel and tourism business in 1993. The fact that he speaks six languages—Arabic, English, Urdu, Hindi, Farsi, and Dari--was helpful in getting business.

The U.S. Army in Iraq needed interpreters and Mohamed worked as an interpreter from 2007 to 2009. In 2010, based on his work for the U.S. Army, Mohamed obtained a special visa to the U.S. and went to Austin, Texas, where he had a friend. A nonprofit organization helped him find a furnished apartment and paid the rent for six months. After six months, Mohamed was able to buy a car and drove 1600 miles alone to Arlington, where he stayed for two months with friends. He found Culpepper Garden, applied, and moved in April 2011. Mohamed is a student in Level 3 English at NOVA, where he plans to continue through Level 5. At that level, he will be eligible to take technical courses in air conditioning. He enjoys cooking his own meals, since he likes spicy food. He has always kept up with world news and regularly attends the Monday evening current events discussions. He will go to China in September-October 2018 and then to Pakistan to visit children and grandchildren. He is thankful for excellent medical care, has had successful surgery and cataracts removed. Friends took him to celebrate his recent birthday at Urban Tandoor that serves the spicy food he loves.

PUBLIC LIBRARY BOOKMOBILE VISITS - Sept 5

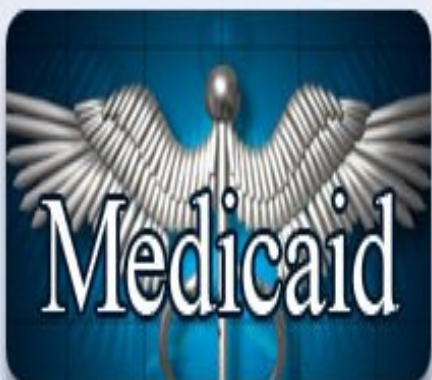


The first Wednesday of every month, a staff member from the Main Library and several volunteers come to Culpepper Garden to bring a variety of books for you to check out.

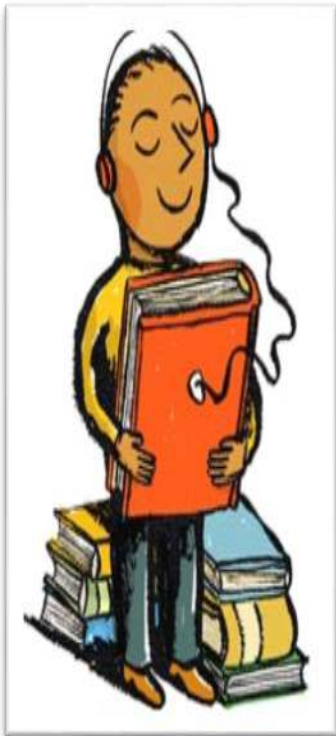
