DEVELOPMENT NOTES

FEDERAL EARMARKS TO SUPPORT **CAMPUS RENOVATIONS**

The United States Senate passed the Transportation, Housing & Urban Development Appropriations Bill that will award \$2.03 million to Culpepper Garden, the only affordable housing community in Arlington serving financially vulnerable older adults. The updates will include renovations to apartments, installing elevators and walkways, as well as other upgrades to improve the quality of living and accessibility for residents.



HELPING HANDS FOOD PANTRY

This year, we constructed, stocked, and inaugurated the Helping Hands Food Pantry to serve residents experiencing food insecurity. Field to Table, an Arlington-based nonprofit organization, gave us a generous grant to build this permanent food resource.



INAUGURATING THE MIGRATORY BIRD HABITAT

In October, we inaugurated the Migratory Bird Habitat, one more addition to the restoration of our grounds in honor of the late Kit Britton, a Culpepper Garden resident whose vision brought the habitat to life. The new addition was made possible by a grant from Keep Virginia Beautiful with landscaping work donated by the Balfour Beatty Gilbane Company.



HONORING ARLINGTON'S BEST

In April, Congressman Don Beyer and Arlington County officials joined Culpepper Garden staff for a dedication ceremony in honor of the city's first responders at our flagship daffodil garden.

FALL PLANTING EVENT

Every October, on National First Responders Day, the Culpepper Garden community and residents come together to fill our garden with fall bulbs to prepare it for spring blooms.

3RD ANNUAL BBQ & BLOOMS

In June, we hosted our annual BBQ & Blooms fundraiser where we raised \$120.000 to benefit care subsidies for our most vulnerable residents in assisted living who have depleted their financial resources and can no longer afford the cost of their care.

2024 Legacy of Grace HONOREES

This year, the Legacy of Grace honors were awarded to long-time board member Susan Philp along with volunteers Valerie Welsh and Mclean Bible Church's John Mathai. The award recognizes honorees' contributions in service to our residents and our organization.






